This role is intended for individuals interested in learning field-based work and supporting active project teams in a hands-on, outdoor setting. This is an entry-level position, and previous field experience is not required. Training and mentorship will be provided. We are looking for someone who is curious, dependable, and interested in developing skills through on-the-job learning in a supportive team environment.

Based on performance and project needs, this role may offer the opportunity to transition into longer-term or full-time employment.

Applicants with previous forestry or field experience are also encouraged to apply. For candidates with additional experience and capacity, opportunities for expanded responsibilities and higher compensation may be available.

Role Overview

As a Field Assistant, you will support forestry and field teams while learning practical, transferable skills. Responsibilities may include:

- Learning to use maps, compasses, and GPS tools to navigate and work safely in forested environments
- Collecting and recording accurate field data using written notes and digital tools
- Assisting with the safe operation, care, and transport of field equipment and tools
- Supporting worksite safety and following established safety procedures
- Working as part of a team that values communication, cooperation, and quality fieldwork

This role offers the chance to build confidence, learn new skills, and spend meaningful time working outdoors as part of a supportive field team.

Work Schedule & Conditions

- Primarily field-based work with some travel and time working out of town
- Possible field shift rotations and camp work
- Flexible field scheduling where possible
